UNIQUE MEETING VENUES







Fort Concho National Historic Landmark was

established in 1867 to protect frontier settlements. Today, it is a historic preservation project and museum offering five meeting rooms that may be rented for day and evening functions. Choose from Officer's Quarters 8 (50-75 ppl.), the Commissary (150-250 ppl.), the Quartermaster, Barracks 6 (100-125 ppl.), or the Stables, the largest space available for rent, with seating capacity for 360-600 ppl.



The First Financial Pavilion is a 20,000 sq. ft. facility with occupancy for 1,320 and with more than 2,000 parking spaces. It accommodates 98 10x10 exhibit booths, seating for up to 1,000 people with rectangular tables or 700 people with round tables. The pavilion is a climate-controlled, smoke-free facility, perfect for hosting meetings, receptions, business events, and trade shows.



San Angelo's grand historic City Auditorium opened its doors on February 8, 1929, and has a seating capacity of 1,328. Located within City Hall at 72 West College Avenue, the venue is home to the magnificent Murphey Performance Hall & Stage, which has hosted an amazing array of talent including Elvis Presley, President Bill Clinton, humorist Will Rogers, bluegrass sensation Alison Krauss, and comedian George Lopez, to name a few.



The Historic Cactus Hotel, one of the original Conrad Hilton hotels, was built in the 1920's and offers six meeting rooms ideal for meetings, receptions, and dinners. The Cactus Ballroom showcases the original design from the '20's and is a great option for an off-site lunch or upscale dinner. The top of the Cactus offers gorgeous views of downtown San Angelo and vistas of west Texas. Additional meeting space includes the Green Room, the Mezzanine, the Lobby, and the Meeting Room.

Foster Communications Coliseum is a circular-domed arena with permanent seating for 5,000 and 2,000 portable seats. The arena floor is 20,000 square feet and can accommodate 122 8x10 booths. The climate-controlled facility is idea for trade shows and exhibits.



If you are looking for unique venues that offer a big WOW for your off-site events, consider the Pop Art Museum or Paintbrush Alley, both located in Downtown San Angelo. Two of the reasons San Angelo was recently named the Visual Arts Capital of Texas, these outdoor, open-air venues feature murals, paintings, and sculptures all created by local artists through Art in Uncommon Places. These venues would make a nice addition to any meeting or convention.



The San Angelo Museum of Fine Arts is a beautiful facility located near the San Angelo Riverwalk. The museum features meeting space that may accommodate 280 people for a reception and 200 banquet style.



The San Angelo Performing Arts Center located in the heart of Downtown, has four meeting rooms available for rent. Studio can accommodate 50 people theater style. Black Box can accommodate 120 people theater style and 80 people banquet style. Theatre can accommodate 300 people. Lobby can accommodate 150 people for "come and go" receptions.
